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

Q: What was your first thought when you started writing and when?

While writing the book, my first thought was that I hope I do justice to the stories because they were inspired by my grandmother's tales. I did put a lot of pressure on myself to write responsibly and make sure the stories had substance and quality, because they're a tribute to my favorite storyteller.

Q: What literary pilgrimages have you gone on?

Well, it wasn't a literary pilgrimage, per se, but in Paris, I visited the famous Shakespeare and Co bookshop for itsincredible history and rich heritage. I also loved the Ernest Hemingway tour of Paris, where I retraced the life of the great writer during his time in Paris.

Q: What is the most unethical practice in the publishing industry?

The most unethical practice in this industry is the business of paid reviews! Not many book bloggers and reviewers are interested to review a book without being paid and this is unsettling because it means integrity and quality of reviews is tremendously compromised. Ultimately, readers and book lovers are misled, and that's not fair to them or the authors.

Q: Does writing energize or exhaust you?

Writing does both- energize and exhaust. It is a very intensive exercise and consumes so much of one's mental, emotional, and physical resources that it is bound to exhaust the writer. However, the fact that you're writing and finally seeing that story on paper, does lift your spirits.

Q: Does a big ego help or hurt writers

I think a big ego wouldn't work for anyone, in any profession or industry, even more so in the creative line of work. Our work is so subjective that it comes under a lot of scrutiny and criticism-rejection is a part of everyday life and one has to take critical feedback in the right spirit.

Q: How did publishing your first book change your process of writing?

Publishing my first book has actually had zero effect of my writing process. It should've ideally made me more disciplined, but it really hasn't. It's the same old battle - procrastination v/s productive work, everyday.

Q: How do you feel being an author?

"Literary success" is a big phrase! I think to be happiest if someone who bought my book thinks it was worth his the time and money and that he got value out of reading my book. When I get feedback from children, about how they enjoyed reading Tales from the Himalayas', that means success to me.

Q: What's the best from to market your books?

Social media, hands down. The way we consume media has changed dramatically and so the marketing efforts have to adapt to the changes. It for one consume news, features, entertainment is entirely online and mostly on social media-it's the platform to market everything from books to real estate!

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

Research, to me, is of utmost importance because it lends depth and dimension to your story. A solid story is a well-researched story and this has been ingrained in my system since the beginning of my journalism days. I do thorough on-ground research, in-person and phone interviews, referencing and lots of reading before I begin.

Tales from the Himalayas is a collection of seventeen short stories from Uttarakhand, the Himalayan state of northern India, invite young readers to discover the mountains, through its stories. Just like the people of Uttarakhand, their stories are simple and heartfelt. There are tales of snow leopards, ghouls, and monsters, of courage and kindness, but most of all, about having faith in oneself. While the backdrop for these stories is the rustic setting in remote, high-altitude villages and towns of Uttarakhand, possibly far removed from the worlds of the readers, the central themes and characters of the stories aim to be relatable and relevant for children anywhere in the world. The endeavor is to offer children a taste of culture and tradition from the Himalayas and an appreciation for diversity.

Stories such as, 'The bagpiper' offer an insight into the musical history and tradition of Uttarakhand, while stories such as 'Kaafal'are my adaptations of local children's folktales, passed down by oral tradition for hundreds of years.


Another highlight of the book is a story called 'The villain' touch upon a very deep-rooted issue in Indian society - that of color prejudice, especially amongst young girls. The story aims to help children appreciate their uniqueness and accept their color of skin and their bodies, with pride. The book also features two reallife characters and their stories -Gaura Devi, who pioneered the 'Chipko movement' (tree-hugging) to set an example for forest protection across the world, and Nain Sigh Rawat, who is one of the greatest explorers and surveyors in the continent. Both real-life heroes from the Himalayan state of Uttarakhand.

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

It's a mix of both. INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR S.G. BLAISE

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

Writing is my dream come true and my passion. There is nothing else I would rather do.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

The Last Lumenian started out as a dream during a cross-country European trip in 2012. As I was writing the idea down, in the middle of the night with the only illumination coming from my phone, that dream morphed into a story spanning multiple books. The final push to writing my book came from simple advice: Just sit down and write. Which I did! Worked on the story for six years until it was ready to be published.

Q: How does writing bring out the best in you?

Writing changed me in so many ways and is still changing me. It's hard to put into words. Writing is therapeutic and healing. It revealed aspects of my personality that I wasn't aware of until then. Writing taught me to be more open-minded and patient. I learned that writing is a journey and not a sprint.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

I think winning a competition is one of the most amazing ways to get validation on the hard work one puts into their book. It is an honor and a wonderful feeling. I am happy to share that The Last Lumenian has won four awards since it was released.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

Being a writer allows you to highlight aspects of life, magnify issues and show how they can play out if nothing changes. It also allows you to show life where certain issues are not considered issues, but simply part of normal life - accepted, and not discriminated against. Both of these aspects can be powerful for the reader as they experience the story unfold and get a new perspective about life.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

"I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel." ~ By Maya Angelou

Q: How do you feel being an author?

I absolutely love being an author! I have dreamed about writing ever since I was 10 years old.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

For me, being a writer means telling the best stories possible for the reader. Providing them a much-needed escape from reality for a few hours.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

Writers are their own worst critics, often resulting in giving up on a draft merely because they believe it is not perfect. It takes perseverance and commitment to keep going, often for years before the manuscript is ready for publication.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

When I write my books, I strive to tell a cinematic and immersive story that the readers can't put down

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

Emotions and past experiences allow a writer to add their truth to an otherwise fictional story, thus creating a universal connection between the reader and the made-up characters.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I usually spend months developing the story before I start writing. Since my books are Sci-Fi/Fantasy, I also spend a lot of time on world-building, even though most of them don't make it into the story, only the necessary information that helps move the story forward.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

Thank you for the honour and opportunity to feature my book and me in your magazine, DE MODE. It was an unexpected and pleasant surprise.

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR K.J. KRUK

Q: How does writing bring out the best in you?

It allows me to hop out of the craziness of my normal day-to-day life and just let go of all of the noise and drama and mentally paint whatever I want to create. In many ways, it brings out my nerdy inner goddess!

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

I didn't start to write my book thinking that I was doing anything more than creative journaling. But I did have a final "I need to publish this!" moment when I recognized the fact that my younger self could have been uplifted by its story.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Though my work has certainly won a surprising number of awards, I don't chase public approval for any art that I create (books included!). Actually, I think the whole concept of rating any form of art is so grossly objective that I'm still baffled as to how it's done! But I do believe in patting yourself on the back for hard work or even small triumphs, or tantalizing yourself into getting one more interview done! I always need a bit of extra encouragement for those. There will definitely be a mini "Go me!" party at my house after this.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

It's become clear to me, over the years, that the majority of readers are still praising major corporations over individual authors. (And this applies to authors on both sides of the traditional publishing fence.) You're not going to get diversity if you keep eating from McDonald's or Burger King your entire life. If you're a true book lover, you need to go out and find those special, hole-in-the-wall eateries like Anthony Bourdain. And for publishers looking to thrive in these new times, they too need to realize it's only a matter of time before readers gain more curated access to those exact book-eateries that agents keep failing to point out. It's not always the case, but a good number of books pushed out by top houses are generic slices of bread that most closely resemble their top-earning, popular book. For the sake of human intelligence, publishing houses and readers alike need to get more creative and less selective with their selections. If you shop consciously, read consciously! And support books for their rare and unique art over their trending "Everybody's Reading It" Instagram status.

Q. What is your favorite Quote?

"In all that you do live love." Too many people think of love as an overrated romanticized act. Instead, it's a magic key to living the life you've always dreamed of. Just live love. The rest will follow!

Q: How does writing inspire you the most?

There's always something brewing in my brain that I want to get down on pen and paper...but Time is always yapping at me to do otherwise. So I'm always so elated when I do get a moment to sit and write it all out and express myself creatively. There's absolutely nothing better than tapping into raw, free-flowing imagination.

Q: For you, what is the meaning of being a writer?

Being a writer is being a creator. It's being bold enough to speak your story and insightful enough to realize that everyone will think one way or another about it. But, at the end of the day, they will THINK!

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I write what I want to read or what excites me in the moment, so I don't think or try to project how others will consume my mind's blabbering. However, when I get to editing, I do stop and attempt to take things in as a multitude of potential readers, to hopefully clear out any misreadings. But I genuinely try to keep my work as close to what I originally wrote and was imagining during the time when I was in my "creative element" as possible.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I don't do any research before or during my writing process. Now, I might have to look up a term or two that I've forgotten or double-check my mental scrapbook on something I learned years ago...But I wouldn't write on something that didn't come to me naturally. Where's the fun in that?

Q: Do you have an upcoming book?

I do have an upcoming book! (Or maybe two...) And you know the drill: Spoilers!

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR D.W. PLATO

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

I've wanted to be an author my entire life, literally, as long as I can remember. Year after year, I put it off, destination procrastination, time restraints, self-doubt, etc. After a life-altering tragedy in January of 2015, I realized just how short life is. Death has a way of putting important things into perspective. It was that heartbreak that pushed me to pen my first novel, The Sinners' Club. I wrote it in seven months but then it was as if the flood gates were opened and couldn't be closed. It felt very great to hold my first novel. It was overwhelming.

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

I'm not sure it does, LOL! Sometimes when I write I'm crabby and irritable, the marketing aspect makes me crazy and anxious but with any innate talent, practice makes perfect. Writing pushes me out of my humdrum life giving me a break from reality and the creative process makes me happy.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Rewards. Awards are based on a panel of judges of one sort or another, a small group of people. Rewards resemble karma to a degree, you get what you give.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

My writing is contemporary even though my subjects are mostly historical. That's fresh. Plus, I have a soft spot for life's underdogs, specifically women, women of color, and the LGBT community. There is a much-needed trend happening with these marginalized groups. It would be amazing if my stories could somehow benefit that movement.

Q: How does writing inspires you the most?

I get the majority of my novel ideas while traveling. When I get really inspired it's usually because I've come across a factual event that needs to be told. With each story I write, I feel there is a message for the reader, and being able to teach, or enlighten my audience is inspiring.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

There is no 'meaning'. What is the meaning of being an actor, an athlete, or an artist? Writing books makes my heart sing and everyone should do what they love to do whether it has meaning or not.

Q: What is your favorite quote?

In the writing world: "You can always edit a bad page, but you can't edit a blank page", Jodi Picoult. In my everyday life, my epitaph, the quote that will be on my headstone, "We'll figure it out."

Q: How do you feel about being an author?

Accomplished. As mentioned, I've wanted to write books forever and now I've started, I'm not going to stop. It's a feeling of achievement. How many people can say, "when I was a child I wanted to grow up and be a (fill in the blank)"? I can.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

That quality work is easy and free, it's not. To put out the best work possible, a writer needs a team; beta readers, editors, cover designers, narrators, etc. These things aren't cheap but necessary to produce a quality product. My best advice to anyone thinking they want to publish a book is to start by getting a good editor, two if you can afford it (it's the best money you can spend on your book). Also, a new author needs to define why they are writing in the first place. If it's about money, they may want to rethink where they're putting their resources.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

Original. I write for me, not necessarily the readers. The readers are the exquisite sounding board I get to continually practice my craft.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

The research is my favorite part of the creation process! I've travelled to the other side of the world for research, interviewed people, read books on similar subjects, watched films, and of course, (my favorite resource) Google. My research doesn't end until the final draft is done. I've got no problem rewriting or adding something to a manuscript if I've discovered something new along the way.

Q: Do you have an up-and-coming book? What's it about?

I have a personal goal to write a book a year for the rest of my life, so the short answer is yes even though I don't know what those stories will be about, yet. historical fiction is my favorite genre but I would love to dabble in other realms like romance, thrillers or sci-fi.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

Wow! (is 'wow' a feeling?) I'm honoured, excited, and grateful. Although I don't have any grand expectations about being an author, this opportunity has left me feeling fortunate and proud of my work. The idea your readers will be introduced to my stories thrills me!

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR XANDREA CASTALDI

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

I believe writing is the emotional conviction of passion, and the strength of it ebbs and flows over the course of a project. There are some stages where it wanes when I'm eager to write but no words come. But in the times where everything - ideas, words, and passion - align, it's a beautiful flow to be in.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

"Do it, what are you waiting on? The only person stopping you is you, and if you died today would you be happy with never having done it?"

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

It's a natural way for me to connect to what I believe I am good at and want to be better at. It's usually one or two things every person can do without needing to be paid to do, and for me, that's writing. I'm an imaginative person with a researcher's brain, so I get to tap into every personal strength when writing.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

I do, but for me personally, intrinsic motivation and the things I get from the process are rewarding in themselves. It is a wonderful thing to receive recognition and accolades from peers and leaders in a particular field or industry, nor would I turn them down having rightfully earned them. However, my most valuable reward comes in the process of creating a captivating journey through words and having others go on and enjoy that journey.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

As a young black woman, I decided that my first published novel would be within the science fiction genre. That alone is a step toward further change in many literary circles, even though it's not a new concept by any means. I recently came across a post on social media that aimed to discredit black sci-fi authors on the sole basis of being black sci-fi authors and all I could do was smile. Not only am I a black woman, but many of my characters are also of different nationalities and backgrounds from across the world. My writing doesn't reflect my world, it reflects the world. Diversity in science fiction is not and should not be an exceptional concept. It should also not be a concept that writers of colour should be forced or expected to be the sole champions of.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

Being a creator, the master of world-building, but also having an outlet for my creativity. I get satisfaction with many forms of creativity but writing is the outlet that's become the most personal to me. It provides a voice that I am incredibly selective about using.

Q: How do you feel being an author?

Like I'm just getting started. I've been writing for twenty years but am just now publishing my own books, so I'm learning more about the business side of authorship, which I didn't think I'd enjoy but I do. It feels like I'm doing what I'm supposed to be doing.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

There's nothing new under the sun, so I try to bring original ideas to similar tropes, but I overall stay original. There isn't much research that goes into what readers want because that can be a detriment to what I want to give. Every reader wants something different, and those that want what I have, take it. Those that don't, won't. And it's okay to not be "for" everybody.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

I don't think feeling emotions strongly is a disqualifier if someone wants to write. I think having a story or idea and not writing it is the only hindrance.

Q: What kind of research you do & how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

Many times accidental research is what leads to a story idea, but once I start writing, I research according to where that story appears to be going. More research goes into the writing process as it's happening, not prior. I've written many stories where I'll research something and end up not using the scene I researched for, but will still use the information to enrich the world, character, or dialogue. So I blend it into the writing process. Once I finish the first draft and am set on how the story goes, I'll go back and research to fill in gaps, make more accurate certain styles, languages, mannerisms, settings, etc.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

I'm honoured, humbled, and blessed to be featured with DE MODE. Any way provided for an author to thrive is a blessing, so I thank you very much for the amazing opportunity. I hope that readers enjoy reading "The Sovereign" as much as I enjoyed writing it.

'LOST UNIVERSE: THE PROPHECY'



INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR TAYLOR S. NORMAN

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

Writing is my passion. I am sure that everyone was born with some special talents and abilities. These can be writing, singing, acting, dancing, and so on. Every person has an opportunity to follow his or her own way and achieve great success.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

I wrote my first book [] for the LGBTQ community and women coming out!

Q: How does writing bring out the best in you?

My soul is filled when I write. I am grateful for every precious moment my writing journey offers me. It allows me to see the miracle in each experience.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Rewards grateful to write. The reward for work well done is the opportunity to do more. Faith is to believe what you do not see; the reward of this faith is to see what you believe. The most difficult thing is the decision to act, the rest is merely tenacity.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

By writing my heart and being authentic. Authenticity is everything! The keys to brand success are self-definition, transparency, authenticity and accountability. Details matter. That inner voice has both gentleness and clarity. Truth is a point of view, but authenticity can't be faked.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

'In order to write about life first you must live it' ~ By Ernest Hemingway

Q: How do you feel being an author?

It means being vulnerable to others. For me, being vulnerable means sharing your own feelings openly, bravely, but also having the guts to allow the other person to go at their own pace, even if you are anxious for them to move quicker. It means being patient, trusting, allowing the other their own experience.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

I love being an author. I love the challenge of bringing a book to life, of creating something from nothing other than my thoughts. I love getting a more organized mind, the diverse creativity that

writing brings out in me, the constant learning, and most especially, the camaraderie.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

Don't focus on it being perfect. Trying to be perfect is something a lot of people have tried, but none have succeeded. It's impossible to be perfect, no matter how hard you try. What typically happens is someone pushes themselves so hard because they want to be good at writing, that eventually it turns into more of an obsession with being flawless. You're aiming to be perfect without even realizing it.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I write original works from my life experiences. Readers want something that's real. They want to live in your book. They want to become your characters and feel every joy & heartache right along with them. They want to see, smell, hear, feel taste. It's one thing to create a story. But if you're using your life, your experiences, and your personality, then you have all the material before you even start.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

Anyone can write, you do need some depth. Let pieces of your life interweave themselves into your book, along with completely made-up parts. It's a more flexible option than writing your life story. You can edit out the parts you don't like and add plot twists you think would make it better. It keeps that realistic feeling.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I don't research subjects.

Q: Do you have an upcoming book? What is it about?

My upcoming book is '**Awaken Me**' sequel to The Lesbian Whisperer in my trilogy.

The book is centred around Author Effie's spiritual awakening with moments of revelation & magic. The poems were written on aeroplanes, in passenger seats, on a friend's couch & in the middle of latenight hauntings.

'High Priestess' is a brief but meaningful chapter in Kalaitzidis's life that was the catalyst to align her with divine purpose. Sometimes someone comes into your life for a season & changes it forever. The majority of the book is about falling in love with what someone is mirroring back to you - the light & the dark & that letters you write to the moon will come true. Priestess starts out with a section of prose titled "Quarantine Tarot Reading" that gives the reader a look into what a typical lockdown afternoon was like for Kalaitzidis - trying to communicate with the ghost in her friend's apartment while reading tarot & doing ritual. The poems in the book tell the story through angel numbers & tarot cards, of how Kalaitzidis started opening up to the way the universe was speaking to her through signs & symbols. This is something most readers will be able to relate to like seeing 11:11 on the clock or finding a feather outside to let you know you're not alone.

'High Priestess' felt like the perfect title for Kalaitzidis as she now works as a psychic tarot reader, but also because the whole time she was writing the book she was completely unaware that she would publish it someday. While writing over the course of the year that changed her life exponentially, she had an inner sense that there was a reason for it & that it would make a lot of sense one day.

FFIE M. KALAITZIDIS is an intuitive tarot reader & poet living in Chicago, Illinois. Before COVID-19, she worked as a professional makeup artist writing poetry in her notes app in her spare time. The effects of the pandemic resulted in her losing her job. Instead of taking this as a step back, she used it as an opportunity to heal & deepen her spirituality. One day she decided to start sharing her tarot messages on Tik Tok & went viral overnight with one of her videos reaching 2M+ views. This resulted in her starting her own tarot reading business. The messaging in her reading advocates for others to share their unique talents & creative expressions. As a leader & wanting to set a good example - she decided it was time to publish her first poetry book.

The response was overwhelmingly positive & created a stronger sense of community amongst her followers. Effie has a passion for the arts in all regards & is often quoted saying things such as "be art" or "life is art" - reminding others & herself constantly that we are all ethereal beings here to enjoy this human experience for what it is, no need to make it stressful - "we get to co-create our realities it might as well look how we want it to." It wasn't always this way - before the pandemic, while working as a makeup artist, Effie was constantly burning herself out at both ends, living a life of routine, sleeping on a friend's couch & feeling trapped & uninspired.



By freeing her mind of self-limiting blocks & opening up to her spiritual gifts she was able to unlock a completely new direction for herself. Although it wasn't easy & there were a lot of things to be sacrificed, friends & connections lost, things that had to change, it was worth it in the end. Kalaitzidis hopes her story can inspire other artists or creatives who are feeling trapped to work on their blocks to experience the type of freedom she has been able to create for herself.

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR EFFIE M. KALAITZIDIS

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

While I am very passionate about writing, most of my poetry & inspiration comes from emotion. I'm a Cancer sun & moon meaning I'm highly sensitive & empathetic, I feel EVERYTHING & it took a while to learn to not let my emotions consume me, but rather that I should transmute that energy into art & self-expression.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

I remember one morning in August. I had been workshopping a collection of poems for a couple of months & I had this feeling like I needed to just do something with it. It was honestly very out of the blue & pretty impulsive. A lot of the poems in the collection were for somebody that I no longer had a connection to - the love was unrequited & it almost felt like a complete waste. I knew I couldn't think of it that way I needed to alchemize the situation & grow from it. The story from beginning to middle really inspired me & it didn't even have an ending yet.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

I believe in rewards - awards are physical & mean nothing to someone like me. It is more rewarding for someone to tell me that my poetry inspired them to pick the pen back up again than for me to get some sort of award or acclamation for the work that I've done. I don't do it for validation. I do it to inspire.

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

Writing brings out the best in me because it is how I best express myself creatively. It's something that's always come really naturally to me & when I share my poetry with others I feel like I am being my most authentic & true self. Being authentic & sharing my inner world is how I share my light with others. It's truly magic because writing the poem is healing for me & reading the poem is healing for the person on the other end of it. It's important to share the things you're naturally gifted at - these are usually passed on through different lifetimes & they may have to do with your soul's purpose for reincarnating. I have an artist's soul.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

I plan on bringing change to the literature world by continuing to share my poetry - I feel as if poetry was slowly being forgotten. With the effects of the global pandemic & more people waking up to remembering that life is about more than the 9-5 job & the money etc, I can sense people will start being creative again even if it's just for themselves. I want to be an example of there being another way. While the effects of COVID-19 were damaging for some - it was a necessary upheaval for others - I think there will be a huge way of new art that

comes from this change. I'm excited to be a part of that revival.

Q: How does writing inspires you the most?

Writing inspires me the most when it comes out of nowhere. In the middle of the mundane that random burst of creativity that I can channel into something that just works & flows. I think that moments like those are super powerful. The process of writing when an idea strikes like that is sometimes more moving for the poet than the actual poem.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

Being a writer is defined to me as someone who can notice the small details of the world around them & exaggerate & romanticize its meaning into something anyone else can relate to. There doesn't have to be any other meaning other than being an observer. Writing is a detailed recording of the way you are experiencing your reality.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I definitely try to be as original as possible but there have to be some elements that are for the reader, that's why I like to use angel numbers or tarot cards as poem titles. Maybe the numbers mean something specific to me & the poem's story but it can mean something entirely different for the reader but that's what gives it meaning to them.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

The research that I do for writing comes from the daily information that I gather in my spiritual discoveries as well. My writing is heavily influenced by symbols & signs from the universe so I am often journaling the meanings to different number combinations or street names or the type of butterfly I see on a walk. Poetry is in the small details of things. Sometimes you can find a deeper meaning to a poem by researching the smaller details a little further, it's like finding a hidden gem. I like to add those elements to my writing. Since my writing is very personal I think adding those universal codes for people to find help invites people into the story & gives them a way to make it their own.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR CARLOS HARLEAUX

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

I self-published my first book, Blurred Vision, and did a lot of research on my own for about two years before I started the process. I kept making excuses for myself, mainly from fear. Money was my last excuse. A few months before I released Blurred Vision, I received a bonus from work that was almost exactly what I needed to publish my book. So, that eliminated my last excuse.

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

Writing helps me organize my thoughts and, more importantly, it allows me to purge a lot of feelings. Overall, it's a wonderful way for me to express my creativity.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Awards and rewards are wonderful. I think everyone loves to be recognized to a certain extent. However, I don't think anyone should chase awards because they all boil down to someone else's opinion of your work. I believe people go wrong when they create with the intention of recognition. That just stifles the true creative process. The audience can usually tell the difference as well.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

My goal is to write material that is not only thoughtprovoking but also inspires people to make a positive change. Also, I like to try things that haven't been done before or add a new twist. For example, one of the deciding factors for me to release my poetry book, Eleven: Things We Never Said, was the fact that there weren't many books that dealt with divorce specifically in a poetic style, from a male perspective.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

I have so many. That's a hard one. The first one that comes to mind is from the late Maya Angelou: "I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel."

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

For me, writing is taking experiences, thoughts, and observations from everyday life and making art from those moments. A great writer grabs you and pulls you into the experience with them.

Q: How do you feel being an author?

I absolutely love being an author. I may be a little biased but I think it's one of the greatest professions. Writing allows you to explore various personas, places, and events that transcend time.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

The main traps I hear from aspiring writers are not knowing where to start, being too critical of themselves, and not having a clear vision. I believe those three things are so important. Many aspiring writers get stuck in their thoughts, which blocks them from the very thing they should be doing: writing. Just write. Sometimes, you just have to write and forget about trying to make every word and sentence perfect in the moment.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

Sometimes it's a hard line to tow because as a writer, you do want readers to connect with your work. However, I think originality always wins. Don't try to be the next Stephen King, J.K. Rowling, or Shonda Rhimes. Just be you. People can sense authenticity and I think that is only recognized through originality.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

Most definitely. I know several writers who are what many people would label "emotionally detached" in real life. However, they tend to let their writing show emotions. That's not my path as a writer, but I think it's possible.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

The research typically depends on the book. For my latest book, A Swipe in the Wrong Direction, I researched information about online dating site trends and feelings towards it from people who have used it. According to some data I found, the busiest day for online dating profile activations is the first Sunday after the new year. That's why I decided to release the book on Sunday, January 3, 2021.

Q: Do you have any upcoming book? What is it about?

Yes, I do. I'm working on a novel called Trigger Pointe. At first glance, "Pointe" appears to be misspelt, but it's a double entendre because the main character's last name is Pointe. The book details several triggers that ultimately lead him to turn towards an illegal means of making money to survive. I've been writing that book for a little over a year now and I plan to release it sometime in 2022.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

Q: How does writing inspire you the most?

I feel it's the other way around; I'm inspired to write. Everyday occurrences spark new plots for future work. I could be anywhere, and the what-ifs begin to unfold. My mind has always worked that way...looking for alternate endings in different situations.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

A dream I had after reading an Anne Rice (writing as A.N. Roquelaure) novel. It's the first part of Chapter One in Facade. It was so vivid, I had to write it. After letting a few close friends read it, they had to know what happens next. I wanted to know as well.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Give me a quote from a bestseller author regarding my book over an award any day. I guess that would be a reward. I also love to hear from a reader who stayed up all night to read my book...they couldn't put it down. Knowing they escaped in my words is so satisfying.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

By breaking the rules. My Unbroken series breaks lots of rules. Is it romance? Suspense? Women's fiction? It's all the above—and more. I write about real life. People don't always get their happily ever after. When one door closes, another one usually opens, and for the better.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

"In the case of good books, the point is not to see how many you can get through, but rather, how many get through to you." ~ Mortimer J. Adler

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

Passion—although I write with lots of emotion. My current, or the next story, is always floating through my mind. I'm constantly writing even when I'm not in front of my computer. I admit I get frustrated when other responsibilities keep me from it. The middle of the night seems to be the time my mind is most active.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

To get my stories out for the world to read, and I have so many of them. I come up with at least ten great story ideas while writing one. I'll never catch up. Knowing readers around the globe are enjoying my words defines me as a writer.

Q: How do you feel being an author?

Very proud. That sense of accomplishment to publish my work for others to enjoy.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

Well-meaning friends and family who offer to edit your book are a significant step before you hire a professional. English teachers/ professors may have command of the language, but they don't know the nuances of dialogue and fiction writing. I made that mistake — don't do it.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

A movie projector plays in my mind when I write. I feel like I'm more of a stenographer than a writer, typing as fast as possible to keep up. I go where the story takes me—I can't force it.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

Fiction...probably not very well. You can't write a thriller or mystery if you can't express fear. Or a romance novel without explaining the internal body reactions and sensations when someone you love is nearby. Nonfiction, absolutely. Facts and figures don't require emotion.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I typically research as I write. Thank you, Google! I'm what you call a pantser; I write by the seat of my pants. I needed medical facts to learn for my latest book and what would burn hotter and faster when water is used to extinguish it—fun stuff like that.

Q: Do you have an upcoming book? What is it about?

The Job, a suspense thriller, released March 30. A killer with ethics—retired because one was broken. Called back for one last job. This time, it's personal. Destroy the mark and take away everything he loves. When the target's wife is racing the clock to release a groundbreaking cancer treatment to save millions of lives, can Sam fulfill the contract?



Q: How do you feel being an author?

Editing while they are trying to write. When they do that, all creativity stops and they often find themselves unable to complete their work. Solution: complete the book, then edit it.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I always try to be original, I want to surprise my readers. I want them to hate and love the twists I pull on them. I want my books to feel like a breath of fresh air.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

Possibly, but I believe it makes writing harder. In good fiction everything is three times bigger, so for a writer to reach that level they will really have to strive.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?



Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?





Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?


It depends on the situations but usually, I refer to the internet for my sources. As for how long it takes, I keep going until I'm accurately satisfied with my sources.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?





Q: How does writing inspires you the most?



Izzy - I survive this outlaw MC world of fighting, killing, and gambling. It was the hand I was dealt in life. And when you're desperate to keep the ones you love safe and alive, you will do anything. I come face-to-face with the devil himself – Stryker – the President of the BERZERKERS MC. Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

I think they can still be writers because maybe they feel strong emotions through their writing, which may be therapeutic.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

Writing is my passion, and I'd like to help inspire others who express themselves through writing. I'm a big supporter of new aspiring writers and hope to be more of a marketer or promoter someday!

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

One of the provoking thoughts that made me write my first book was that life is way too short, and when I'm long gone, my written words will remain for others to read.

Q: How does writing bring out the best in you?

Writing brings out my imagination and compassion for others. I write from 1st point of view of the character, and it feels as though that character is telling the story, not me.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

I believe in rewards rather than receiving awards – even though awards from your peers' recognition can

be accomplishments to be proud of too.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

One of my favourite of many quotes is, "I must not fear. Fear is the mind-killer." by Frank Herbert from his book, "DUNE".

Q: How does writing inspire you the most?

Writing inspires my mind and keeps it open to imagination. I sometimes wonder what it feels like to be someone else, what it feels like to live in someone else's shoes.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

The one common trap I've personally fallen into as a writer is my self-doubt. To all those aspiring writers out there – believe in yourself and don't take everyone's negative opinions about your work stop you from writing.

Q: For you, what is the meaning of being a writer?

Being a writer is a way of expressing myself, like a painter, a player of instruments, an actor, or a singer.

Q: Do you have any upcoming book? What is it about?

I have a few upcoming books to release in 2021. My next book, "Dane" is the 3rd in my Capitol Corruption Series – a romantic suspense story about Dane Neri, a corrupt man in organized crime who falls in love with a woman who's one of his enemies.

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

I am passionate about my writing and do it from my heart and soul. It energizes me, even it at times pulls out my teeth's until I'm exhausted. Emotionally, I've spent four tough years completing my books. I wanted to give up, but then my passion, anger, and feelings pushed me to complete the projects. Giving up was never an option.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

Helplessness! I wanted to scream. Get the anger and the abuse out of my system. I needed to shed light on, a tabued subject of fake adoration from love scammers, and sociopaths. With this real-life tale of the double-edged sword of love, readers will find the line between love and manipulation is anything but clear-cut.

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

I craved to shed light on psychological abuse. Increase awareness of the blindness in adoration and the fake love sociopaths use to mentally abuse others. Living with a narcissist is more than difficult to get through. I feel good about telling the story as I believe it can help other preys and non-victims to understand about mental abuse.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

The best award was finishing, and achieving my lifelong goal of writing my books and get them published. The best reward I got; I grew emotionally and mentally stronger and got my life back. No reward or award can beat that.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

Hopefully by involving readers in the real-life story of emotions and struggles gives a glimpse into this rare life from the victim's perspective. However, the series does a profound service to readers – exposing the truth of what it's like to live and fall in love with a stop-atnothing, callous psychopath. Maybe it's the first series of its kind on the market.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

Q: How does writing inspires you the most?

I learned so much about myself and how to be an even better person. My tolerance grew stronger along with more understanding of other people's daily struggles. My knowledge of the world grew vastly within my curiosity in my research.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

I needed to get control of my physical and emotional devastating life. I was like the wreck of a ship in my own vessel. When Part 2 was published it felt as I had claimed Kilimanjaro and my burden fell off my heavy shoulders. The misery stopped squeezing my heart and soul. I was free of the agony.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

All the promises from the self-publishing companies. They only want your money and not what's best for you. And too many Instagrammers who offer paid reviews for you on Amazon. As a writer, you can easily fall into those traps. Don't! It can damage you.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

In 2014, I began to research sociopathic behaviour and along with my first-hand experience dating a sociopathic man, I reflected on that entire experience. In 2016 I got the courage to write and along with my writing, I continued researching, which often related to my ideas popping up for the books.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I'm only original. I'm aware of my way of writing is different from other Authors. But I am who I am, and I will not compromise with my true story and pretend something else. The writing is as I've experienced it, with humour, sadness, anger, trauma, love, and joy.

Q: How do you feel being an author?

Exciting! Exhausting! Funny! And time-consuming! But it's also life-changing and inspiring. I learned many new English words and found joy in how to control synonyms in both my first language and in English. I got wiser with social media and research in what you must do to get success.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

Yes! I consider myself as living proof as I was not feeling emotionally strong when I began my writing process. Yet, I succeeded in becoming a writer, even I had to backtrack years of my unfortunate life. Had I felt emotionally strongly there would be no story. If you want to reach the goal, you can achieve it.

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

Both. One can't exist without the other. My passion is driven by emotions.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

If you would have asked the girl back in 2015 that came to London for the first time as visit, I would have said: Because I want to be a writer. Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

It reminds me of who I am every day. Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

"Remember to look up at the stars and not down at your feet. Try to make sense of what you see and wonder about what makes the universe exist. Be curious. And however difficult life may seem, there is always something you can do and succeed at. It matters that you don't just give up." ~ Stephen Hawking.

Q: How does writing inspires you the most?

It teaches me lesson in life whenever I write. And the best thing and inspiration from me is, that sometimes I discover parts, words, ideas and imagination of myself that I didn't know I was capable to write down until I do it. Besides that whenever I read words from some of my favourite authors, I am amazed what words can do in our minds and how they can touch us.

Q: How do you feel being an author?

It's crazy, magical and wild and I am totally blessed by living this dream. Because at twelve I started to have this dream, at fifteen I spoke it out loud the first time and now I made it happen and live my dream.

Q: What kind of research do you do before beginning a book?

I have two types of research phases. The one before, when it comes to world building because I need to take certain information into consideration for certain scenes. The second phase is more of my kind because I'll do my research while writing and that's when I add things usually to my vision board, get into the deeper layers of the characters etc. Without research half of my book wouldn't exist. It's essential.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

A good mixture of both. Originality comes certainly first but to the readers who love my book and enjoy the journey, I am here to listen to them and see what the readers would love and like. And when it comes to diversity and LGBTQAI+, I always consider facts.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

Yes. Because even if you are someone that isn't capable of having that strong emotional connection it shouldn't stop them from trying and going for it anyway. The emotional aspect is one thing in the writing process. The research is another. The message here is essential, you can be anything and anyone in the world of art. Nobody is perfect and you certainly don't need to be, to be a writer.

Q: Do you have any upcoming book?

Melancholy Vision has just been out into the world and I am already working on the second book in the series as well as the German translation of it. This is just the beginning in a series of eight books but as I said it's a multiverse and the sister series called Oleander Chronicles is also already a work-in-progress.

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR TASHA BOYD

Q: How do you feel being an author?

I love being an author. I know how I feel when I get lost in a book. I get to travel on a vacation of the mind away from my every day worries. I love that I get to bring that to others. Several times I have received messages from people who are sick or caring for a very sick loved one and they have shared that my books helped them forget and feel happy or escape for a little while. And that is enormously satisfying to know you have brought someone a small joy.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I don't try to do anything other than writing the story as it wants to be written. If I tried to make something original, I would probably fail. Story uniqueness comes from my unique perspective about how I see the world, so I tell the story my own way. Do I want to give the readers what they want? Sure. I'm a reader so I give myself what I want too!

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

It depends. For my historical fiction, there was a lot of research not just about my character who was a real person, but about the politics and socio-economics of the time in which she was living. Not t mention I had to research and understand the intricate and complicated process of extracting indigo dye. But then I write a fun romance set in the South of France, and yes, I have been there so my experience is based on research of sorts, (and what fun research that was! Back in precovid travel times), but mostly it's an opportunity to marinate in my imagination and google beautiful images on the internet. And drink a lot of rosé (for research of course).

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

I'd never tell anyone they can't be a writer. I imagine it might be difficult to write if you don't feel empathy, because how could you fully climb into your character's shoes? You might simply imagine what it's like to be in their shoes which probably means a deeper level is not reached. But I don't know. I sometimes cry while I'm writing certain scenes (for sure in my newest book BROKEN FRENCH) but I'm not sure that makes me a hetter writer

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

My first book? I wanted to write a fun story that I wanted to read. A modern Cinderella story about a famous guy picking an ordinary girl. I couldn't find one I liked, so I wrote one! It's called EVERSEA, about a movie star named Jack Eversea.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

Whether you think you can, or think you can't, you're right. (I can't remember who wrote it. Perhaps the business self-help guru Jim Rohn? But it's my favourite because your mindset in all you do is the most important thing to master).

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

Worrying about what others will think is a common trap that stops being from writing. It is difficult to keep the voices of family and friends and critics silent long enough to write as if they are not looking over your shoulder and judging. You can try to pretend to be someone else as you write. And don't tell anyone what you are doing if you don't want to. Writing is for YOU, not them.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

There should always be change when needed. Right now we need to hear more diverse stories that more truly reflect our diverse world. Stories that have been forgotten or ignored before by perhaps narrow-minded publishing executives. I think that's why my book The Indigo Girl continues to do so well because we are hungry for untold women's stories, but also we are hungry for minority-centred stories, culturally educational stories and stories of real human struggle and joy. Also, one note about romance novels. It is one of the largest selling genres in the world. One could argue it keeps the publishing industry afloat. It's time it was celebrated. The women characters depicted in modern romance are strong, and they know (or find) what they want and need in life.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

Thanks for featuring my book in DE MODE. If anyone is missing travel like I am then they will LOVE taking an armchair vacation to the French Riviera with my characters in my newest book BROKEN FRENCH. INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR SADEQA JOHNSON

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

Writing is my passion.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

I'll try to write a book and if it doesn't work out, at least I have a job in publishing and I'll still be surrounded by books.

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

Writing balances me. When I don't write I feel cranky and my patience is really short.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Awards, please bring them on!

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

By writing about people who have been marginalized and blotted from the history books.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

The entire universe is conspiring to give you everything that you want."

Q: How does writing inspires you the most?

Writing inspires me to rub myself raw and then be brave enough to let in the air that will heal my wounds.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

Showing up everyday and getting words down on the page. Even when I don't feel like it. Even when I don't think I have anything important to say. Even when I'm afraid. I must show up.

Q: How do you feel being an author?

It's a blessing to be able to create a whole world from my imagination. It's so rewarding when readers tell me that they've stayed up all night finishing my books. It's the best job in the world. I am living my purpose.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

They give up before the miracle happens.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I write for myself first and then hope that someone wants to read it. The story has to embed itself into my skin, the characters need to follow me around and insist that I write their story. That's when I know I've got something.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

I believe everyone can write, all that's needed is willingness and belief.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

For Yellow Wife, I spent about three months researching before I started writing. I visited plantations in Virginia, went to libraries, museums and read books about slavery and pre-civil war. As I was writing the book, I would come upon a scene that needed detail, like dressing a woman and I'd have to stop and look that up. I have to be careful because sometimes research is more fun than writing.

Q: Do you have any upcoming book?

I'm currently working on my fifth novel. It's in the beginning stages but it's a historical novel that takes place in the 1940s and 50s.

Q: What is it about?

I love writing about women who have surmountable challenges that they have to overcome. In my next novel I'm writing about two women.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

This has been awesome! Being interviewed by DE MODE makes me feel hip and relevant, thank you!

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Due to a lifelong fascination with Ancient Greek mythology, **Author Jennifer Saint** read Classical Studies at King's College, London. She spent the next thirteen years as an English teacher, sharing a love of literature and creative writing with her students. ARIADNE is her first novel and she is working on another retelling of ancient myth for her second.

Writing has always been a passion for her. She has been writing stories for as long as she remembers. For Author Jennifer, it's a way of escaping to another world and inhabiting different voices that can be soothing, therapeutic, absorbing or frustrating at times – but always worthwhile. However, writing was something she found she was always putting to one side especially once her children were born and there were always so many demands on her time to manage her teaching career and her family. The writing felt like an indulgence and was something she wasn't prioritizing until she decided to write ARIADNE and make writing part of her daily routine again.



INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR JENNIFER SAINT

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

The inspiration for ARIADNE was a combination of factors. I had always loved Greek mythology and read Classical Studies at university, which was where I discovered Ovid. He was a Roman poet who wrote a series of letters from the perspective of the women in myth and this collection included Ariadne and her sister Phaedra. Years later, when I was reading the story of Theseus and the Minotaur to my children, I remembered Ovid's Heroides and wondered if anyone else had written Ariadne's story as I was so interested in what that familiar legend would look like from her perspective. I couldn't find a version of it so I decided to write it myself.

Q: How does writing bring out the best in you?

Writing makes me put my phone down and switch off from the rest of the world. It gives me the opportunity to focus and to work hard at something. Everything I write teaches me something new and allows me to hone my craft. I feel like there is always so much to learn and so many ways to develop and it's such a privilege to be able to do this.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

Research is an ongoing process all the way through writing a novel for me. I start by reading as much source material as I can – plays, poems and texts from ancient Greece and Rome about the characters and myth that I'm writing. I also look at paintings of classical subjects and I search for vases, statues and artefacts from the past to immerse myself in the subject as much as I can. I have a separate notebook for each novel & I keep adding to my research as I go.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

It's great to be rewarded! I feel like the best reward I can get from writing is when readers respond to my work. Hearing that my novel made someone cry, that they connected with my characters and that they were transported to the world that I built – this is the most rewarding thing in a writer's life. Books have changed my outlook on the world and books have made me feel inspired and moved in so many ways so to know that I can do that for other people is just incredible.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

There is such an appetite at the moment for Greek mythology retellings from new perspectives and I'm

very proud to be a part of that. These are stories that belong to us all; stories we all heard in childhood and that so many of us love. But the stories are so much richer when you look beyond the heroes, magic and monsters to the heart and soul within. I think it's so valuable to retell and reinterpret these tales in a fresh way and to draw the parallels between ancient lives and the way we live today – there are still so many relevant themes and messages and there is something very special about sharing a direct connection with the long-distant past.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

I love Mary Shelley's quote when she was writing Frankenstein. She wrote 'I felt that blank incapability of invention which is the great misery of authorship when dull Nothing replies to our anxious invocations.' I find it so helpful to remind myself that all authors experience this! Even Mary Shelley, while writing a Gothic masterpiece that was innovative in so many ways, felt the grip of writer's block but she went on to create a work that we still love now, two hundred years later. It inspires me to keep going even when it feels impossible and to have faith in myself.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

A part of writing is observing the world and people around you so that you can create characters that your reader can believe in. I definitely call on my own emotions in my writing and without that, I'm not sure I could make a reader feel those emotions as well.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer and how does writing inspire you the most?

Anyone who writes is a writer! I always worried that I couldn't call myself a writer until I got an agent or a publishing deal but the truth is that if you write, you can and should call yourself a writer. There isn't a set of qualifications that you have to achieve first. You just need a pen and paper, or a laptop or even a phone – and an idea!

I like to read a range of books and enjoy writers from a broad selection of genres who inspire me differently. I love the way that Barbara Kingsolver transports the reader into nature.

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR & DR. SHAMOLY KHERA

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

Interesting question. I would say both. Writing for me starts at bringing clarity in my thoughts, till it heads towards having its own purpose and life. It certainly is an emotion of expression, one that I have deep passion for.

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

There was a dearth of literature on confidence, something that talks about where confidence stems from – that answers questions like is confidence a trait that we are born with or do we build it as we grow? While coaching people to emanate confidence while speaking, I realised that it was equally important to train their minds effectively besides training their voice and body. Hence, as a cumulative effect of bringing all this research together, Bedazzle was born.

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

Personally, writing is an extension of what I think and believe in. I voraciously recommend writing to everyone who needs to bring clarity and structure to their views & thoughts. Besides, writing paves the way for other like-minded people to connect with you.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Awards gratify the ego; rewards satisfy the soul. Both are essential for human motivation and are instrumental as a push to keep moving forward.

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

We as authors cannot plan a change on will. The changes will be visible on retrospection. As our books release, you will notice the kind of changes it has on its' readers, on critics, on future writers – every book has its own life and charts its own path. A great example of such change is Chetan Bhagat's writing – it opened the doors for college stories of romance told well and a huge market for young authors with young stories flooded the market since then. As far as my writing is concerned, I do hope to inspire lost souls to find their confidence, to choose what they want and someday share their transformation with the world.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

There are so many. One that comes to my mind right now is 'If you think you or think you can't, you're right' by Henry Ford. Our limitations are created by self, just like our goals and ambitions.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer?

For me, being a writer is bringing meaning to the chaos in the world around us, to make sense of the mental chatter. Being a writer is opening the doors of the mind of those who read, making them see things that they might have missed, of making them feel new emotions, of uplifting, enlightening and inspiring them

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I am extremely conscious about evidence based research – everything that I write or talk about needs to have an authentic source to make a valid point. Hence, I don't rest until I am sure I have the exact information I need. In terms of time, I keep making notes, collate material that seem connected with what I am planning to write. When I feel I have enough clarity on the content of the book, I start the writing process that can span over a couple of weeks.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly and how do you feel being an author?

I feel everyone feels emotions strongly. It's just that the awareness levels of some may be low or they may be less attuned to their own emotions and not express much. Writing in fact works as a therapy for such people, because the more you write, the more you get to know your other-self. That little voice in your head – that's the subconscious mind we need to get acquainted with to write and express.

I feel complete. This has been a dream for too long and being a published author means a lot.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?


Aspiring writers should stop worrying about the existing books or trends in the market. These will keep changing. A writer should write about things that speak to them the most because those are the subjects they will be truest to; those topics have the most potential to create a deep connection with the readers.

Q: Do you have any upcoming book? What is it about?

My next book focuses on women. I feel there is a need to articulately address a lot of issues in today's world concerning woman – I cannot reveal much now but will surely share once it's closer to completion!

INTERVIEW WITH AUTHOR WENDY WALKER

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

I was taking time off from my legal practice and decided that I wanted to find work that I could do on my own schedule so I could care for my children. When I started to think about my options, the idea of writing a novel popped into my mind so I must have always wanted to do it!

Q: How does writing bring out the best in you?

Writing makes me look at the world in a very empathetic way. With every event and person I encounter, I try to understand what drives people and what causes things to happen because that is always the start of a great story. As a result, I have come to think this way and it is now a part of me.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I research as much as is needed for each book. Sometimes it's a lot and other times very little. I always seek help from professionals in the field, and I rely heavily on the Internet as well.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

I think awards are overrated. The publishing world is very insular and often times books are overlooked for awards they deserve because the author is not well connected. My books are commercial fiction and so I focus on the reward of pleasing my audience and bringing joy to readers!

Q: How can you bring up a change in the literature world?

I think that with commercial fiction that is trying mostly to entertain readers, change can occur by introducing diverse characters into the story and by trying to show readers how and why people may come to behave in ways that are not normal or expected. This understanding of human behaviour can increase empathy for others that hopefully will translate into everyday life.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly?

There are all kinds of writers. Some are driven by passion and emotion. Others are motivated by intellectual pursuits and a desire to educate readers. There is room for all kinds of writers. What they all have in common is the desire to share their thoughts and/or feelings with others.

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

Focus on the present.

Q: For you what is the meaning of being a writer and how does writing inspire you the most?

It depends very much on the genre. For commercial suspense, the meaning is truly to provide an escape through entertainment. Since the beginning of time, people have sought to escape the often painful realities of life by hearing stories about other people and places. Books can provide this relief and enable people to rest their worries and find excitement, laughter and pleasure where there may not have been any.

Writing inspires me to be creative and to use my imagination. I am a very linear thinker by nature, so writing forces me to think in a different way.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

There are so many traps for writers! The industry is a business and many writers don't know what it is about when they first get a book deal. It's so important to have the right people helping you along and watching out for you. Many wonderful books do not get the attention they deserve and reach readers who would love them because of the business side of writing.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

It is a combination of both things. I write what I enjoy and feel passionate about, but I always keep in mind what my readers like about my books and try very hard to give them a consistent format and pacing. Readers come to expect certain experiences from each writer they follow and I think it's important to keep them in mind since they are the ones buying the book!

Q: Do you have any upcoming book? What is it about?

My next novel is called American Girl and it will be first published as an Audible Original. Print publication will come at a later date. The Audible format has enabled me to craft the story with some scripted scenes that I think listeners will enjoy. It is the story of a neuro-diverse teenage girl who goes to great lengths to protect the people she loves after a wealthy and ruthless business owner is murdered in their small, rural town.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

This is a wonderful opportunity! Thank you for having me DE MODE.

Q: Is writing your passion or emotion?

Yes! I didn't know it before, but once One Hundred Daffodils sold to a publisher, and I was writing full time, I discovered that I had never felt as much joy with any kind of work before as I did while writing this book. Writing is now my passion!

Q: What was that final or provoking thought that made you write your first book?

One Hundred Daffodils began as journal entries that I wrote while contemplating in my garden. They began to take form as a book when my best friend, who works in literary publicity and marketing, told me she felt these short essays could be valuable to readers if they were collected together in a book.

Q: Do you believe in awards or rewards?

Absolutely! I have won many professional awards over the course of my life, and appreciate the recognition of my peers and the industry at large. Sometimes, even being in the running is enough. One Hundred Daffodils has been considered for the National Book Award and a Pulitzer Prize, which is amazing to me - especially for my first book!

Q: What is your favorite Quote?

"When crisis strips away our masks and guides us inside to our authentic selves, the beauty it reveals can be staggering. When we are unmasked, we are vibrant; we are radiant. When we are wholly ourselves, it is holy." ~ excerpted from I Am Autumn, in One Hundred Daffodils

Q: How does writing brings out the best in you?

Writing helps me explore my personal experiences more deeply, and gives me a vehicle to analyze and understand them. Whenever we examine ourselves and do the internal work to understand why we act and think the way we do, that makes us better, more compassionate people. When we improve ourselves, it's better for us, those around us, and the world.

Q: How does writing inspire you the most?

Writing is simultaneously private and unprotected. It is intimate and exposed. What inspires me most in the process of writing is the exhilarating feeling of being completely and totally honest - fully and courageously oneself. There is great personal risk in writing for the public to read, but the freedom one feels when having the bravery to tell the truth is enormous.

Q: What are common traps for aspiring writers?

I think the biggest traps for aspiring authors are self-criticism and listening to the negative warnings of others. It is easy for people to tell you that you cannot be or do what you want to be or do, but you must not

listen to them. Your life is yours to create, and your dreams are yours to claim.

Q: What kind of research do you do, and how long do you spend researching before beginning a book?

I am extremely conscious about evidence based research – everything that I write or talk about needs to have an authentic source to make a valid point. Hence, I don't rest until I am sure I have the exact information I need. In terms of time, I keep making notes, collate material that seem connected with what I am planning to write. When I feel I have enough clarity on the content of the book, I start the writing process that can span over a couple of weeks.

Q: Do you think someone could be a writer if they don't feel emotions strongly and how do you feel being an author?

I think everyone feels emotions strongly. Some people just do not give their feelings a voice. Those people, in particular, could benefit from the outlet writing provides. However, for a writer to get published, I do believe they must allow their emotions, and also have empathy for others. This is essential for their work to be relatable for readers.

Q: Do you try more to be original or to deliver to readers what they want?

I do not think about what the reader wants when I am writing. I believe that kills authenticity. I write what is in my heart, and trust those words will find their audience.

Q: How do you feel about your book being featured in DE MODE?

I'm delighted and honored to be featured in DE MODE, particularly because One Hundred Daffodils was released globally in hardback, as well as e-book and audio, so, fortunately, DE MODE's worldwide audience will have access to my book, no matter where they live!

ATTITUDES ABOUT SEXUALITY AND AGING



Sex isn't just for the young. Research is showing that older Americans are sexually active.

The sexuality that's such a big part of our teens and young adulthood has more staying power than younger people usually recognize and can continue to spice things up well into old age. Results from a University of Chicago survey published in 2007 suggested that over half of Americans continue to engage in sexual activities well into their 70s. Now another batch of findings from a survey conducted by researchers at Indiana University suggests that 20% to 30% of long-lived Americans are sexually active into their 80s.

Both of these surveys are cross-sectional — snapshots of behaviour in a given period — so making pronouncements about trends would be getting ahead of the evidence. Still, there's reason to believe that sexuality is assuming a larger role in American old age. Millions of men are now taking erectile dysfunction drugs like sildenafil (Viagra) or tadalafil (Cialis). Growing numbers of Americans are enjoying relatively good health in their 60s, 70s, and 80s, and, not surprisingly, the University of Chicago study found a close association between good health and sexual activity among older people.

Consider also who is getting old these days — the baby boomers, a generation that came of age in the 1960s and '70s when sexual mores were changing, and a demographic group that hangs on to its youthful ways.

But the "frisky seniors" storyline can be overdone. Sexual activity does subside with age. Biological factors tug in that direction, as do social arrangements: older people, especially women, often end up single when a spouse or partner dies. The Indiana University researchers found that sexual activity with a partner is common among those in their 20s, 30s, and 40s, dips significantly for both men and women in their 50s and 60s and then drops further once people enter their 70s.

Old age doesn't preclude sexual activity, although it also doesn't make it any easier. Men experience declines in testosterone, which adversely affects sexual arousal and desire. There are agerelated changes to blood vessels and smooth-muscle tissues that can make achieving an erection more difficult. Chronic conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure become more common in old age, and in many men, they adversely affect erections more than any of the strictly age-related changes.

Sexual activity tapers off with age. Both surveys show a decline in sexual activity with age, although the drop-off isn't as steep as one might expect, and a significant minority (especially men) defies the trend. In the Indiana study, 35% of the men age 80 and older reported that they had intercourse with a woman a few times or more in the past year. In the University of Chicago study, 38.5% of the men ages 75 to 85 reported having sexual activity with a partner in the previous year.


Older women are less sexually active than older men. Both studies show that older women — even the "young old," in their 60s — are less sexually active than men of the same age. The gender gap widens as people get older. The University of Chicago researchers noted that the women in their study were less likely than the men to be in a marital or intimate relationship, and even more so with age, presumably because men tend to die at a younger age than women. Differences in the amount of sexual activity that occurs outside of a relationship contribute to the overall gender disparity. In the University of Chicago study, about one in 20 women who were not in a relationship reported being sexually active in the previous year, compared with about one in five men who were not in a relationship.

Partnered sex gets high marks. In the Indiana study, over three-quarters (78%) of the men ages 50 and over rated their most recent sexual experience with a partner as either extremely or "quite a bit" pleasurable. About two-thirds (68.2%) of the women in that age group rated their most recent experience with a partner that highly.

Masturbation is common. Most men (63%) and almost half of women (47%) in the 50 and over age group reported masturbating in the past year, according to the Indiana survey. As with other sexual activities, the percentage declined with age, although a significant number of those 80 and older indicated that they masturbated.

The University of Chicago survey found masturbation to be almost equally common among those in a relationship and those not in one.

Good health matters. The University of Chicago researchers found a strong association between good health and sexual activity, particularly among men. Diabetes seems to have a greater negative effect than either arthritis or high blood pressure on both genders, but especially on women. In the Indiana survey, a woman's evaluation of her last sexual experience did not vary with her self-reported health status.

MAKE DISHES WITH GOOD QUALITY INGREDIENTS & TECHNIQUES

ULTIMATE GUIDE TO BE A HOME CHEF



Cooking is a skill that improves and develops over time with practice. No one is a fabulous cook from day one. I learned a lot through trial and error before I went to culinary school. In the beginning, I had a few successes and a ton of failures. I don't want you to struggle and get frustrated as I did, so I have some helpful tips for you.

- **Use herbs and spices:** There is more to seasoning than salt and pepper. Embrace the power of fresh herbs and dried spices! Herbs and spices are magical and essential for adding flavor and depth to any dish. Using herbs and spices takes your taste buds on a culinary adventure.
- Mise en place: No, I am not speaking English. Mise en place is a French term used in culinary circles that means "putting in place." If you hear some fancy foodie say that they got their mise ready, it means that all ingredients have been gathered and prepped for cooking.
- Take care of your knives: A sharp knife is everything. There is no tool more important in the kitchen than a good knife. It makes your time in the kitchen easier, more efficient, and, believe it or not, a sharp knife is safer. A dull knife is a dangerous knife because the force needed to make a dull knife cut makes you more likely to injure yourself than if you used a sharp knife. There are a few important tips for caring for your knives. First, do not put your knives in the dishwasher. The heat from the dishwasher will dull the knives.
- **Read the recipe:** Reading the recipe through is especially important if you're a new cook. Process and technique matter and to successfully execute a dish, it's important to know what to expect and not miss a step. There is nothing more frustrating than needing a dish to be ready in 30 minutes and realizing that something has to marinate or cool for an hour. Reading a recipe first all the way through will help you avoid a lot of frustration and make cooking a positive experience.
- Salt: Salt is a natural flavor enhancer and can pull out amazing flavors from the simplest recipe. If you're using iodized table salt, consider switching to kosher salt. Kosher has a cleaner flavor, and the large flakes make it more difficult to over-salt.
- **Taste as you go:** Flavors change and develop as you cook. For example, something may get saltier as moisture evaporates, or the dish may lose acid the longer it cooks. It's important to taste as you go so you'll know if you need more salt.
- **Temper your protein:** Normally, the term tempered is applied to adding something hot to eggs, but it's also important to do it with your proteins. Before cooking, leave your protein out on the counter for 10–15 minutes to take off some of the chills. Tossing cold protein into a hot skillet causes it to seize, which results in a tough steak or cut of meat. Leaving it out for a bit helps the protein cook more evenly, keeping it tender and juicy.
- **Dry your protein for a good sear:** Pat your protein dry with a clean towel or paper towel before adding it to a hot skillet. If a protein is wet when added to a hot skillet, it will steam instead of sear.
- **Rest your protein:** I know you're hungry but give that protein a minute to rest. It's been working hard to become delicious. When protein cooks, all of the juices bubble and boil on the inside. If you cut into it right after taking it off the heat, those bubbling juices will pour right out. Give that steak time to rest so the juices calm down and redistribute into the protein.
